A Message From Tim Smith, SSW's Music And Artistic Director

On March 10th we experienced the 1-year anniversary of the last time the members of the Sacramento Symphonic Winds were all together. We had a fantastic dress rehearsal for our "Universe of Sounds" program, which we were scheduled to share with our audience a few days later. None of us could have imagined the course that history would take in the ensuing days, weeks and months – which, for our SSW family, began with the cancellation of our March 2020 concert. There is no need for me to revisit all that has passed since then, as you and I, as well as our families and loved ones have been living it.

El Camino HS, in the San Juan Unified School District, is our host for rehearsals and performances. Recently, the district reached an agreement allowing for a return to in-person learning starting in April. While the district has not released any additional information about the potential opening of facilities to outside groups, we are hoping for a return to rehearsals at the end of August. In anticipation of this, I have already created a calendar of rehearsal and concert dates for our 2021-2022 season – with a plan to start by revisiting and revitalizing the fantastic "A Universe of Sounds" program we were set to perform a year ago! That program will include "Mother Earth Fanfare" by David Maslanka; James Curnow's "Canticle Of The Creatures", a six-movement suite inspired by the writings of Saint Francis of Assisi; "The Seal Lullaby" composed by Eric Whitacre and based on the Rudyard Kipling poem "White Seal"; "Symphonic Suite from 'Star Wars: The force Awakens' by John Williams; and a Western U.S. premiere performance of John Mackey's "Sheltering Sky" that will be accompanied by the Marc Russo animated film.

I encourage you all to continue to check out SSW web site for updates and join all the SSW family in our optimism about a return to making music together and sharing the gift of music with our wonderful audience members and supporters.
